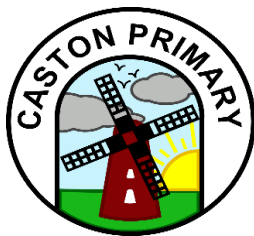
Next I did buggy building and I worked together in a team with my friends.
