

Celebrating Ofsted

We are thrilled to be able to share with you all the outcome of our recent Ofsted inspection. This was our first, which may seem odd to many of you but when Caston became an Academy and joined DNEAT in 2020 we effectively started afresh so, as a new school we have been anticipating this inaugural inspection.

Our visit was the earliest possible in this academic year, just five days in. Children were settling into their classes, new staff were getting to know everyone, exercise books were barely opened and display boards empty, refreshed and ready to receive work. Some of the team had seen inspections before and for others it was a new experience, just days into a new career. All the more reason why I am so very proud that we have been judged 'GOOD' in all areas.

The inspectors recognised our 'high ambitions for pupils' academic and social development' and gave credit for how 'inclusive' we are. They praised the curriculum as 'ambitious' and the children for 'welcom[ing] new pupils to the school warmly'.

Hard copy of the report will come home with children this afternoon and it is available to read on our website now. My thanks to everyone across the school community – staff, children, families, governors, volunteers and other supporters – for your ongoing support. It really is valued and makes all the difference.
